- A company limited by guarantee with charity status
- Separate trading arm – Burton Enterprises Limited
- Accredited by Arts Council England (ACE)
- Awarded National Portfolio Organisation (NPO) status in 2017
- Clearly defined governance model
- Board of 7 Trustees
- Trustees set 3-5 year strategy, Director leads the Business Planning and implementation.

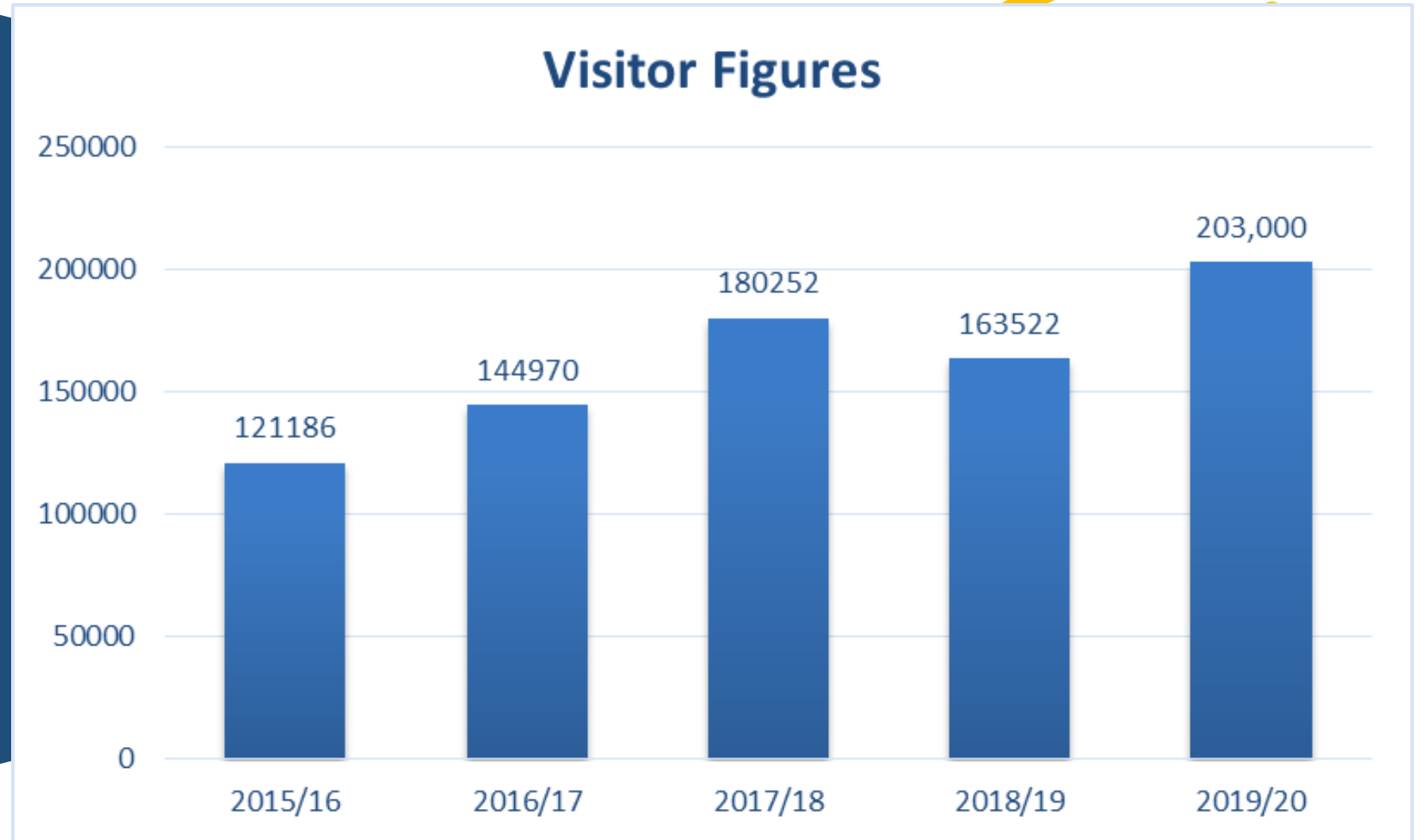

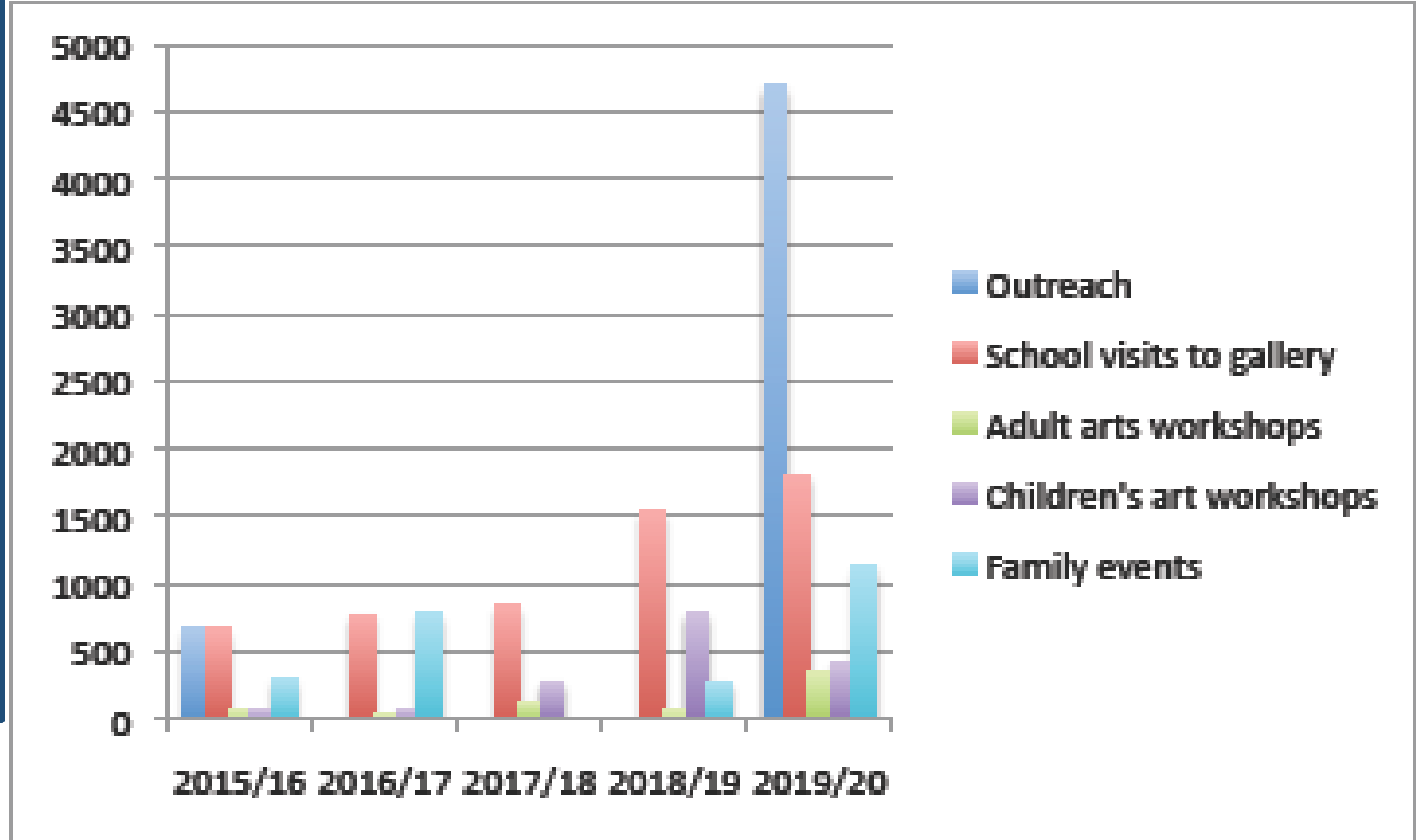
The Burton is thriving

Education and Outreach

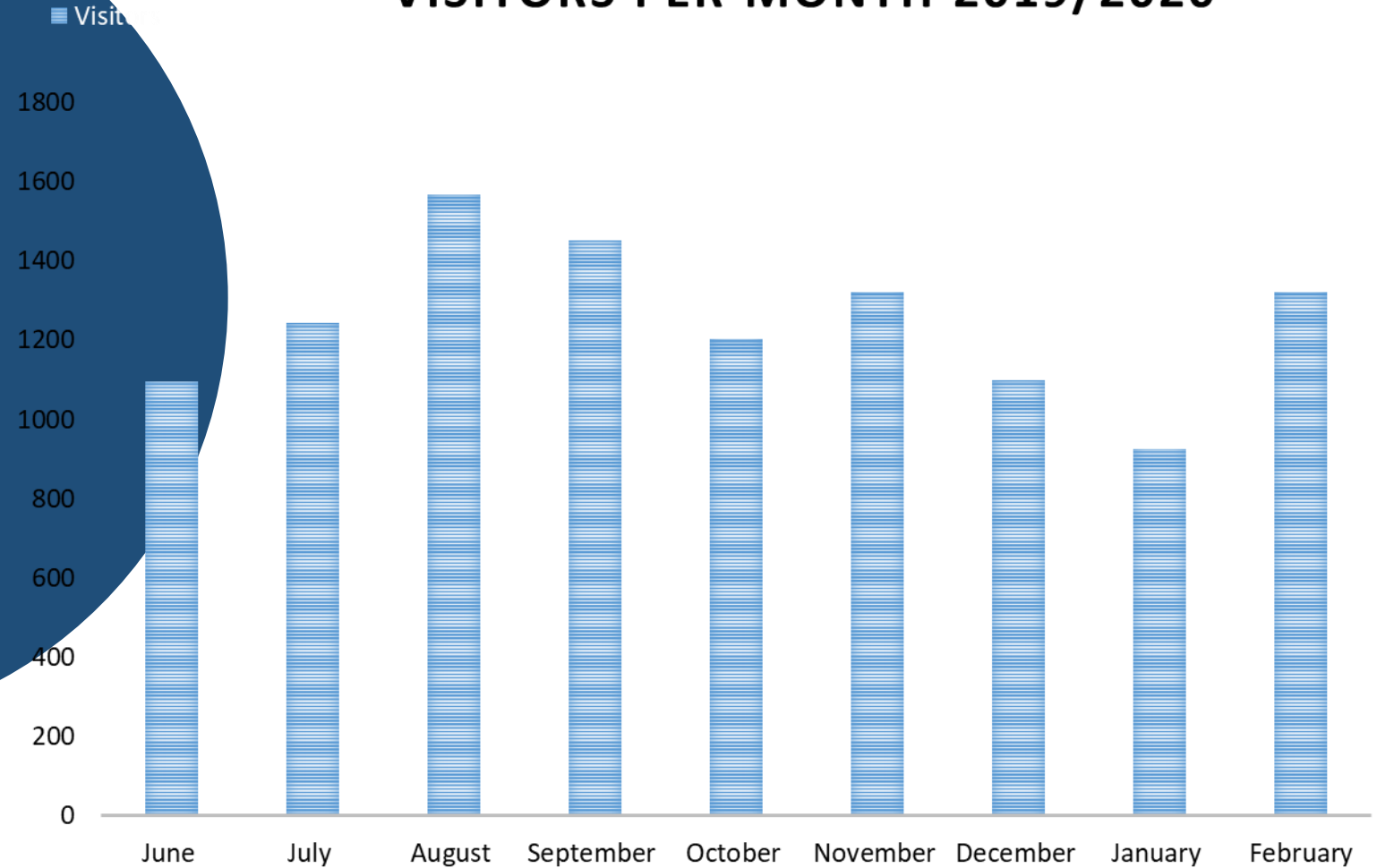


- We get over 10,500 visitors to the Tourist Information Centre each year.

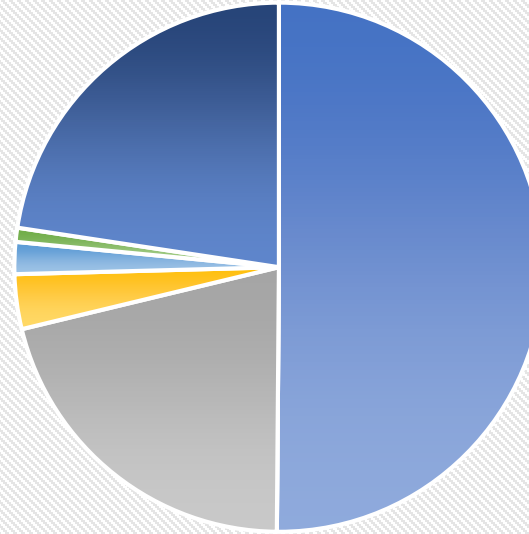

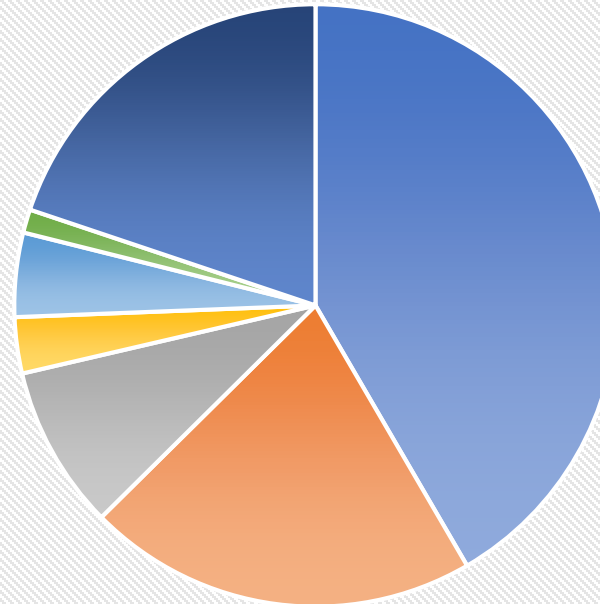

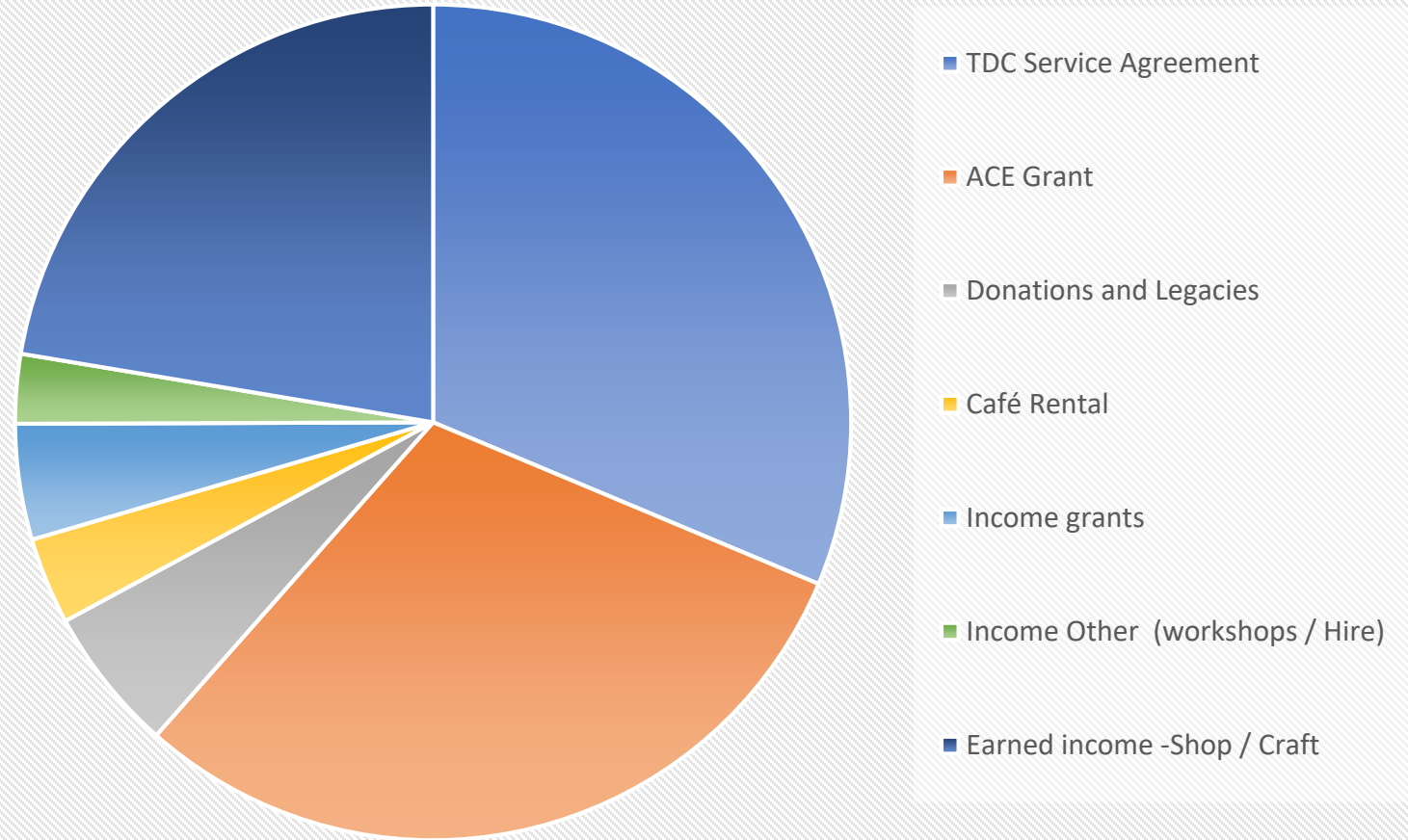
Income 2020/21

Closure:

- Furloughed 6 of the 10 employees, retaining Director, Curator, Finance Assistant and Marketeer.
- Big focus on on- line activity
- Applying for grants where applicable
- Forward planning, rescheduling of activity
- Undertook internal decoration and maintenance
- Reallocation of reserves

2020/21 The Covid Year and our response

The Burton reopened on Saturday 4th July – one of the first in the UK to do so.

Fully open, 7 days a week, focus on doing our best, playing a part for locals, visitors and community

Demonstrating tenacity and determination to continue our success

2020/21 The Covid Year and our response

- Impact on reserves – Lost over £110k in income based on previous years budgets, reserves reduced by over £30k
- First few weeks visitor numbers are c minus 75% on previous year.
- Reshaping the business plan and priorities

Impact on extended Service & Funding agreement 2021/22 – 26/27

We recognize that the extended service and funding agreement needs to acknowledge the impact of the pandemic on TDC finances.

- Trustees acknowledge that we need to be realistic in our financial request.
- Our request for £140k pa represents a 17.5% reduction on 2020/21 which is itself a 5.6% reduction on 2016/17.
- This reduction will be challenging – cannot continue to grow at the rate of the last 5 years
- We remain ambitious.
- To work within this reduced budget we will continue to review:
 - what we can GROW
 - what we will have to STOP
 - What we will put on HOLD or simply MAINTAIN

Aims of the internal review



01

Don't go backwards

Be ready to grow again

Continue to be excellent value for money to Torridge District Council

Be strong enough to retain National Portfolio Organisation (NPO) status & increase the contribution from ACE in 2022/23

Continue the financial stability of the organisation and allows us to be the leading visual arts venue between Bristol & St Ives

In summary

- The success of the Burton in the last 5 years has evidenced that the decision that Councillors made in 2016 was the right one.
- The Burton has exceeded expectations, is financially stable and receives critical acclaim
- The Board recognizes that in the current financial situation the organisation needs to play its part and be realistic in its funding amount for the extended agreement
- Our request is for £140k pa, which represents a 17.5% decrease on 2020/21
